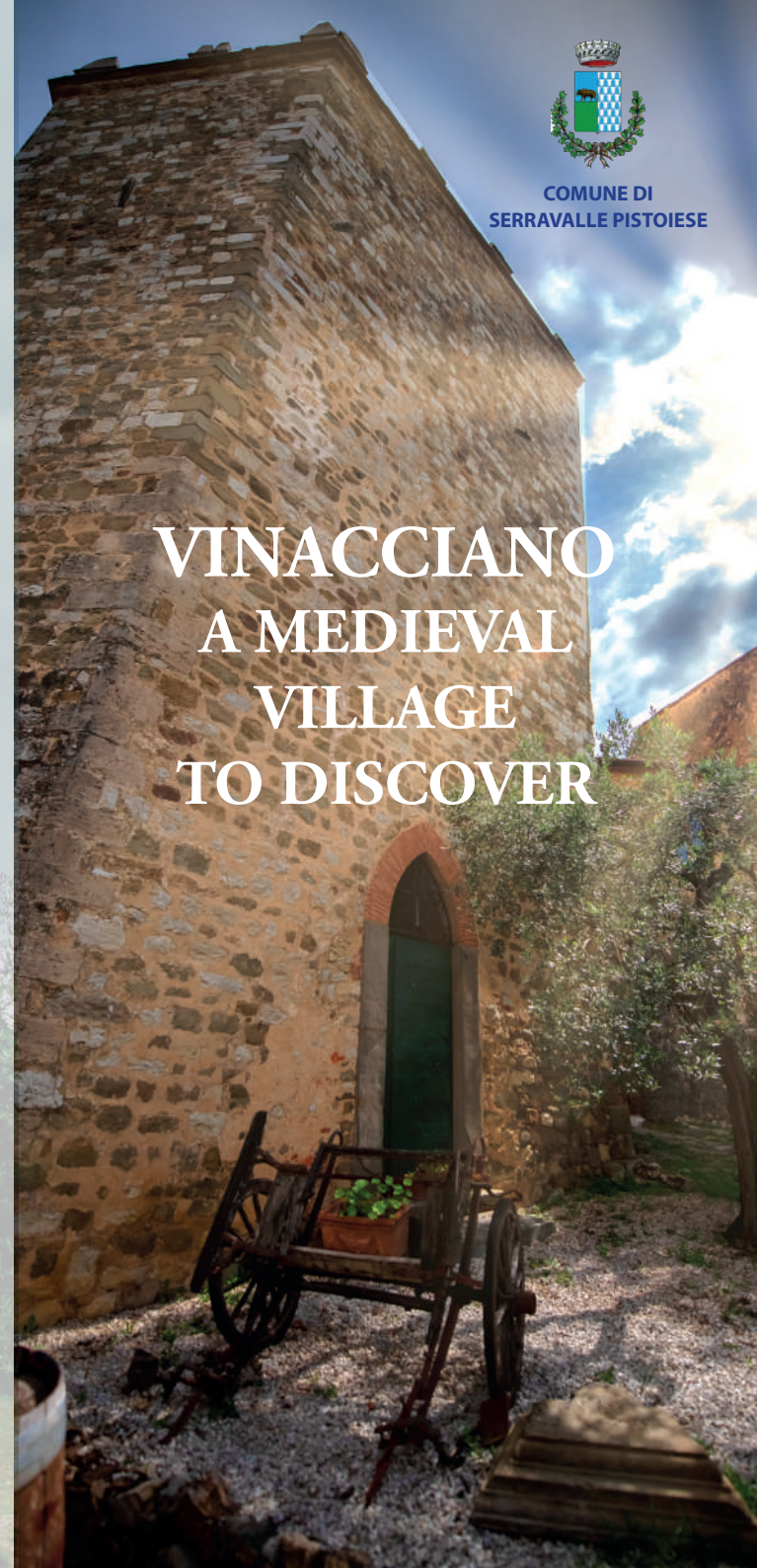

VINACCIANO A MEDIEVAL VILLAGE TO DISCOVER



HISTORICAL INFORMATION

Located on the hills of Montalbano, bordering the fortified villages of Monsummano and Montevettolini, Vinacciano is part of medieval fortifications along the border between the valleys of Valdinevole and Ombrone, which were respectively under the influence of Lucca and Pistoia. The village was involved in the wars battled in the surroundings at the beginning of the 14th century, closely connected to the events that happened in Pistoia and the expansionist ambitions of Lucca and Florence. In particular, Vinacciano became very important during the military expeditions led by Uguccione della Faggiola and Castruccio Castracani in the early decades of the 14th century. Initially under the influence of Pistoia, Vinacciano later passed under the control of Lucca and then Florence, symbolized by the statues of the Florentine Marzocco and a seated lioness at the foot of the pentag-

onal tower, placed by the city of Florence as a symbol of subjection.

MONUMENTS AND CHURCHES

The **Church of Saints Marcello and Lucia**, built between the 16th and 17th centuries, stands on the site of a pre-existing castle oratory dedicated to Saint Lucia and it conserves the 18th-century canvas depicting "Saint Lucia with Saints Anthony the Abbot and Luigi Gonzaga," painted by the Pistoian artist Pietro Marchesini, known as "L'Ortolano." **Sozzifanti Palace (formerly Cancellieri)**, a typical example of a 16th-century fortified building, recalls the typical volumes and architecture of the classical period. Originally, a double staircase provided access to the main door on the first floor, surmounted by the Cerracchi dal Gallo family's emblem. The **pentagonal Tower**, adjoining Cancellieri

Palace and the historical buildings, is the only preserved element of the early medieval fortifications. In the mid-19th century, it belonged to the Arcangeli family, who built a small family chapel on the ground floor and a funeral room with wall paintings on the first floor.

ANCIENT PILGRIMAGE ROUTES

Romea Strata was an ancient pilgrimage route connecting Northern Italy and Northern and Eastern Europe to Rome. Eight of the ancient ways are walkable and one of these, Romea Nonantolana-Longobarda, goes through the hills of Montalbano and the woodland near the village of Vinacciano. Along the ancient way you can see the former Cloister of Saint Maria delle Grazie, dating back to the 15th century and currently in ruins, originally also used as a shelter for pilgrims. From the Romea Strata, it is possible to reconnect with the Way of Saint James thanks to the bypass at Croce di Belvedere.
